RI LEADERSHIP EDUCATION IN NEURODEVELOPMENTAL AND RELATED DISABILITIES (RI LEND)

Interdisciplinary training grant is focused on fostering leadership and providing a rounded, in-depth knowledge of neurodevelopmental and related disabilities to trainees. Applicants must either be matriculated in or graduated from a graduate program (no one who is getting their Bachelor's degree or below) in audiology, genetic counseling, medicine, nursing, pediatric dentistry, public health, physical therapy, psychology, special education, and speech and language pathology OR they can be a self-advocate or a parent of a person with a neurodevelopmental disability like autism (no degree requirements).
